

## **Road Traffic (Licensing of Drivers) Regulations (S.I No 352 of 1999).**

Due to the introduction of the above Regulations on 12<sup>th</sup> November, 1999 Full Driving Licences which have categories higher than B, EB, W cannot be obtained/renewed without submitting a satisfactory Medical report.

Under normal circumstances your application for a licence need not be accompanied by a medical report for the following categories

B – Vehicles with passenger accommodation for not more than 8 persons and with a design g.v.w. not exceeding 3,500kgs.

EB – Vehicles in above category with a trailer attached.

W – Work Vehicles and land tractors, with or without a trailer attached.

Your application must be accompanied by a medical report if:

You are applying for a driving licence in respect of any of the categories C, C1, D, D1, EC1, EC, ED1 or ED unless you have previously provided a medical report which is still applicable. See page 3 of the application form for details of these categories.

You will be 70 years of age or more on the first day of the period for which the licence is being granted.

You suffer from any of the disabilities or diseases listed on the application form.

You have ever suffered from alcoholism or epilepsy.

You are taking, on a regular basis, drugs or medicaments which would be likely to cause the driving of a vehicle by you to be a source of danger.

See page 2 of the application form for details of the Medical examination.
