

CLOUNCREW, or CLUINCINNO:

A parish, in the barony of Upper Connello East, 3 miles (N.E.) from Drumcolloher, on the road to Ballyegran; containing 270 inhabitants. It contains 1663 statute acres, as apportioned under the tithe act, part of which is under tillage, producing good crops, and the remainder pasture and meadow. The living is a rectory, in the diocese of Limerick, and is held in commendam by the bishop; the tithes amount to £72. There is neither church, chapel, glebe-house, nor glebe. The Protestant parishioners attend the parish church of Kilmeedy. In the R.C. divisions it is united to Drumcolloher. On the bank of the river are some remains of the old church, which was destroyed in the war of 1641.
